

Item 1 – Introduction

Curio Wealth (“we”, “us” or “our”) is registered with the U.S. Securities Exchange Commission (“SEC”) as an investment adviser. Investment advisory services and compensation structures differ from that of a registered broker-dealer, and it is important that you understand the differences.

Item 2 – Relationships and Services

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We provide discretionary and non-discretionary investment management and financial planning services to individuals, trusts and estates (our “retail investors”) on a fee-only basis, meaning we do not accept commissions or any other forms of compensation from anyone other than our clients as described below.

When a retail investor engages us to provide investment management services we shall monitor, on a continuous basis, the investments in the accounts over which we have authority as part of our investment management service. Furthermore, when engaged on a discretionary basis, we shall have the authority, without prior consultation with you (unless you impose restrictions on our discretionary authority), to buy, sell, trade and allocate the investments within your account(s) consistent with your investment objectives. Our authority over your account(s) shall continue until our engagement is terminated.

Our standard investment management engagement includes financial planning services. However, we may also be engaged to provide financial planning services only, without investment management services. When we provide financial planning services, we rely upon the information provided by you for our financial analysis and do not verify any such information while providing this service.

We do not limit the scope of our investment advisor services to proprietary products or a limited group or type of investment.

Item 3 – Fees, Costs, Conflicts, and Standard of Conduct

What Fees will I pay?

When engaged to provide investment management services, we shall charge a fee calculated as a percentage of your assets under our management (our “AUM Fee”). Our annual AUM Fee is negotiable and generally ranges between 0.40% and 1.00%. On occasion, a client’s planning needs exceed their investment management needs or there are minimal investments to manage. In these circumstances, a flat monthly or quarterly fee will be charged in place of a percentage asset management fee.

We typically deduct our AUM Fee from one or more of your accounts, in advance, on a quarterly basis. Because our AUM Fee is calculated as a percentage of your assets under management, the more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us for our investment management services. Therefore, we have an incentive to encourage you to increase the assets maintained in accounts we manage. We do not generally require a minimum asset level or annual fee to provide investment advisory services.

If you hire us to provide financial planning services only and not investment management services, we will charge a flat fee generally ranging between \$1,000 and \$10,000 for the financial plan. After delivery of a financial plan, we are available as needed to answer any questions for up to one month. Future planning and reviews would be

billed separately at the rate of \$350 per hour.

Other Fees and Costs: Your investment assets will be held with a qualified custodian. Custodians generally charge brokerage commissions and/or transaction fees for effecting certain securities transactions. In addition, relative to all mutual fund and exchange traded fund purchases, certain charges will be imposed at the fund level (e.g. management fees and other fund expenses).

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we are always required to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. As an example, we may recommend that you roll over an old 401k account to an individual retirement account (IRA) that we manage, which could increase the fee you pay to us.

How do your financial professionals make money?

Our financial professionals are compensated on a salary basis. Financial professionals may receive a bonus based upon our firm's overall success. You should discuss your financial professional's compensation directly with your financial professional.
